The 3rd Malaysia-China International Industry-Education Cooperation Forum & 5th Malaysia-China Vocational Education Fair 2026 serves as an international strategic platform bringing together TVET institutions, industry players, government agencies, technology providers, and educational organisations from Malaysia and the People's Republic of China.

The programme is organised as part of ongoing efforts to strengthen Malaysia-China diplomacy through TVET development, skilled talent cultivation, technology transfer, and stronger industry-education collaboration between both countries.

This large-scale **Malaysia-China TVET collaboration initiative has been driven by YAB Dato' Seri Dr. Ahmad Zahid Hamidi, Deputy Prime Minister of Malaysia and Chairman of the National TVET Council (MTVET), since 2023 through the establishment of the Malaysia-China Institute (MCI)**. The initiative has become an important platform for expanding international mobility, skilled workforce development, and strategic cooperation between Malaysian and Chinese TVET institutions.

As of the end of 2025, a total of 5,426 Malaysian TVET talents and industry workforce participants have benefited from short-term and long-term training programmes in China across various strategic technology and industrial sectors, including Artificial Intelligence (AI), industrial automation, electric vehicles (EV), semiconductors, smart logistics, and future technologies.

The programme also serves as a platform to strengthen collaboration in areas such as technology transfer, dual certification, upskilling and reskilling, student and trainer mobility, as well as the development of a more dynamic and globally competitive industry-education ecosystem.

In addition to the strategic forum sessions, more than 30 leading TVET institutions from China will participate in the education and technology exhibition, showcasing expertise, international training opportunities, and industry-driven talent development models.

In line with the aspirations of the National TVET Policy 2030 and Malaysia's economic development agenda, the programme is expected to become a catalyst for strengthening Malaysia's TVET ecosystem while expanding Malaysia-China strategic cooperation in developing a highly skilled, competent, and globally competitive future workforce.

FORUM THEME & SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

OVERALL FORUM THEME

“FUTURE TALENT, GLOBAL IMPACT”

The forum focuses on strengthening Malaysia-China collaboration in developing future talent ecosystems through TVET, industry integration, technology transfer, global workforce mobility and international strategic cooperation. The overall discussion highlights how governments, industries and educational institutions can work together to produce highly skilled, industry-ready and globally competitive talent for future economic and technological demands.

Session 1: From Training Centres To Talent Ecosystems: Building Integrated Education Cities For Future Workforce

This session focuses on the transformation of traditional training centres into integrated talent ecosystems involving industries, institutions, technology providers and governments. Discussions will explore the development of education cities, talent hubs, dual certification, trainer upskilling, shared facilities and stronger industry participation in curriculum development to ensure talent is aligned with future workforce needs.

Session 2: Closing The Talent Gap: Aligning Skills Development With Industry Demand

This session discusses the growing gap between training outcomes and actual industry requirements. The discussion will focus on industry-driven curriculum, Train & Place approaches, Work-Based Learning (WBL), employability skills, workforce retention and the importance of attitude and adaptability in preparing future talent for high-impact industries and technology-driven workplaces.

Session 3: Beyond Borders: Talent Mobility, Technology Transfer & Career Pathways

This session highlights the importance of international exposure, talent mobility and technology transfer in developing globally competitive talent. The discussion explores Malaysia-China collaboration in cross-border education, international career pathways, global employability and industry partnerships that can strengthen future workforce competitiveness and regional talent development.
